A criminal history background check that meets School of Educational Leadership guidelines. 3. Minimum scores of "3" or higher on a required Candidate Disposition Assessment. 4. Passing Praxis Core Tests or Approved Alternative scores (as established by the Ohio Department of Higher Education) for reading, writing, and math. Alternative scores options include: a. ACT with a score of at least 24 based on Math, Reading, Grammar, and Science b. SAT with a score of at least 1100 based on Critical Reading and Math c. GRE with a score of at least 1100 based on Verbal and Quantitative d. Anyone with a Master's Degree from a regionally accredited institution is exempt

Candidates develop the ability to effectively teach more holistically and increase student growth during their supervised clinical experiences and their student teaching experience.
