
Churches Supporting IWU Students



Graduation 2025 Helpful Info



The Graduation ceremony is on **Saturday, April 26th, at 10 am, in the Chapel Auditorium**. The Chapel Auditorium doors will open at approximately 8:30 am for ticketed guests.

Tickets for Graduation will be distributed beginning Monday, April 7th, at 9 am in the Registration Office (RAS). Each student who plans to participate in the ceremony will receive 8 tickets. If you do not need all 8, please take only the amount you need. Please do not sell these tickets; other students may need them for family members. You will need to present your ID to pick up your tickets. If you are not planning to attend the ceremony, you will not receive tickets.

If you are walking in the April ceremony but plan to finish your degree requirements in June or August, you will need to provide a solid plan to finish your degree to pick up your tickets. That does include providing proof of registration for CLEP tests, registration for summer courses at IWU, or proof of registration for courses outside of IWU. If you have an Incomplete from the Fall 2024 semester, the Incomplete must be graded before you pick up your tickets.

Cap and Gown pick-up will begin on Wednesday, April 16th, from 2-5 pm, during the Grad Fair at the IWU Bookstore. The Registration Office will have a table at the Grad Fair, and graduation tickets may be picked up when you pick up your academic attire. After the Grad Fair, academic attire may be picked up at the Post Office. If you plan to participate in the April ceremony but have not ordered your cap and gown, please visit the IWU Bookstore as soon as

possible.

Baccalaureate will be held on **Friday, April 25th, at 6 pm in the Chapel Auditorium.** This event does not require tickets and is a beautiful time of celebration and worship. Academic attire is required for Baccalaureate and graduates are encouraged to participate in this special evening. The line-up for the Baccalaureate processional will begin at 5:30 pm in the Phillippe Performing Arts Center (PPAC) Auditorium, and marshals will lead you to the Chapel. The doors in the Chapel Auditorium will open at approximately 5:15 pm, and family and friends should go to the Chapel.

Students who have earned Academic Honors (based on the Fall 2024 semester honors GPA) may pick up cords before Baccalaureate beginning at **5 pm on Friday, April 25th**, in the PPAC. If you have earned honors, you will receive an email from <u>RAS.Grad@indwes.edu</u> the week of Graduation. If you have questions, feel free to contact us.

Graduation Day Information

Check-in for Graduation will begin at 8:30 am in the Henry West Banquet Room in the Student Center. Graduates should arrive in academic attire.

After checking in, graduates will have the opportunity to have informal pictures taken in the Jones Leedy Bedford Banquet Room. **The picture area will be available until 9:20.**

At approximately 9:30 am, graduates will be directed to line up in the mallway and led by marshals to the Chapel Auditorium for the ceremony.

The ceremony will last about 2 hours, and you will be directed when to leave the Chapel Auditorium. You will process out of the Chapel, and gatherings with family and friends should occur outside.

Additional Information

Make sure to take your gown out of the package before the day of Graduation. You may want to steam your gown to get out the packaging wrinkles.


